The Hudson Mohawk Chapter of the American Recorder Society (HMRS) began as the Northeast Chapter (sometimes referred to as the Burnt Hills Chapter) in 1966. In the late 1970's, the Northeast Chapter began meeting jointly with the Capital District Chapter (founded in 1976). In 1991 the two chapters merged officially becoming the Hudson Mohawk Chapter we know today. We have an active 52 year history, and celebrate 27 years as the Hudson Mohawk Chapter.

Today our members participate in chapter meetings, and workshops. Many are also active in consorts. As a chapter we promote interest in recorder playing, developing musical and ensemble skills, and we provide opportunities for recorder enthusiasts of all skill levels to meet others with like interests.

Change is coming: Based on our recent survey and conversations with members, it is time to look at options that will help HMRS remain active well into the future. As we move forward, we continue to welcome new members, and to find ways to challenge experienced players as well. That really is a tall order for our small chapter, but we are at a point where we are ready to explore some new options.


HMRS 2018-19 Schedule: We will continue to meet the first Thursday of the month at the Pruyn House. The second meeting will change to: the THIRD SUNDAY of the month at LYNNWOOD REFORMED CHURCH, Carmen Road, Schenectady from 1:30 to 3:00pm.

Why change? More than half of our member surveys indicated a desire to switch one evening meeting to a weekend afternoon. At the Lynnwood Church we will also gain more space for the group, better lighting, no stairs, and easy access to bathrooms.

General Meetings: All are welcome to our general meetings twice a month. During each session we warm up with slower - more familiar music, sight-read something new, and we will focus on music from a folder of selected music. Together we will select music to keep in our active folder to continue playing and to refine for possible performance.

There are tentative plans for a high-intermediate-to -advanced group (those who are comfortable playing soprano, alto, tenor and bass). If there is sufficient interest, and schedule will work, the advanced session could be held from 3:30 to 5 on Sunday
